

# STUDY SCORES & ATAR

At the end of next year each student will receive a study score in each subject and an overall ATAR ranking.

# WHAT IS A STUDY SCORE?

A study score ranks a student against all other students doing the same subject.

Study scores range from 0-50.

If a student receives a study score of 30, it means that they are the middle ranked student.

A study score of 40 places the student in approximately the top 8% of students doing that subject.

# HOW IS A STUDY SCORE CALCULATED?

In general terms, it is the combination of School-based Assessments (SACs or SATs) and external examinations.




SACs are moderated against external examinations and so a student will not know their letter grade until the end of the year.




They will only receive a raw score from their subject teacher.





Generally, in order to obtain a study score of 40 or above, a student will need to score A+ in all areas for a particular subject.



However, there is no way to accurately predict this as this can change from year to year.

# WHAT IS THE A.T.A.R.?

- **Australian Tertiary Admission Rank**
- **The A.T.A.R. is used to rank every student in Victoria.**
- **An A.T.A.R. Of 99.95 is the highest possible score.**

## HOW IS IT CALCULATED?

- The A.T.A.R. is calculated using a process that involves adding together student's study score in each subject.

## HOW IS IT CALCULATED?

- A student's study score in their English subject (or English subject with the highest study score if they are doing more than one) is combined with their highest study scores in three other subjects. This is generally known as your "top four" subjects.
- Any other study scores from your fifth or sixth subject are also added but only as a 10% increment.

# UNDERSTANDING YOUR STUDY SCORE

For studies with large enrolments (1,000 or more):

- 2% of students will get a score on or above 45
- 9% of students will get a score on or above 40
- 26% of students will get a score on or above 35
- 53% of students will get a score on or above 30
- 78% of students will get a score on or above 25
- 93% of students will get a score on or above 20.

# SPECIAL PROVISIONS

- Special provisions are provided to students with defined conditions to allow them the opportunity to complete their secondary level studies and to demonstrate their capabilities in the most appropriate, fair and reasonable manner.
- They may be provided in school-based assessment and Year 12 end of year exams\*

\*This is subject to approval via a written application to the VCAA



# SPECIAL PROVISIONS

Some examples of conditions that may gain special provisions

- Anxiety/depression
- Diabetes
- Back pain
- Epilepsy
- Crohn's disease

# SPECIAL PROVISIONS

Students applying for special provisions will need to:

- Obtain a form from the Curriculum and Programs Leader (either at the end of 2021 or the beginning 2022). It is preferable to organise appointments prior to the start of the year to complete the necessary paperwork.
- Provide evidence (a statement) from a specialist
- Submit the form before the due date (usually early March)

### What is VCAL?

- Victorian Certificate of Applied Learning
- Alternate pathway to the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE)
- Ideal for students who do not intend to go to university and who prefer to pursue a career pathway through apprenticeships, traineeships, or TAFE Courses
- Hands on approach to learning
- Strong community connection

# SENIOR VCAL STRUCTURE AT PCSSC

The Year 12 VCAL course is designed differently to the one that students have been involved in in Year 11 VCAL. The structure is as follows:

- Senior Numeracy or any other equivalent VCE Mathematics subject
- Senior Literacy (Reading and Writing) and Senior Literacy (Oracy)
- VET or School Based Apprenticeship/Traineeship (SBAT)
- Senior Personal Development Skills
- Senior Work Related Skills

# WORK EXPERIENCE AND STRUCTURED WORKPLACE LEARNING PROGRAM

In Year 12 VCAL these differ to the programs that Year 11 VCAL has undertaken this year.

**Work Experience:** 1 week at the end of Term 3 for students who have achieved all their competencies in every subject.

**Structured Workplace Learning Program:** 1 day a week working with an employer who is in the field of their VET course. This is usually undertaken on Fridays and begins in March

# WORK EXPERIENCE AND STRUCTURED WORKPLACE LEARNING PROGRAM

While we support students with finding work experience and SWL opportunities, it is up to the student / family to organise these placements.

# VET IN SCHOOLS

If your child studied a VET in 2021 they:

- Must enrol for 2022 (unless it was a 1 year course)
- Must have Unique Student Identifier

- Not advisable to pick up VET in Year 12 (Unless required for VCAL)

# VET ENROLMENT DATES

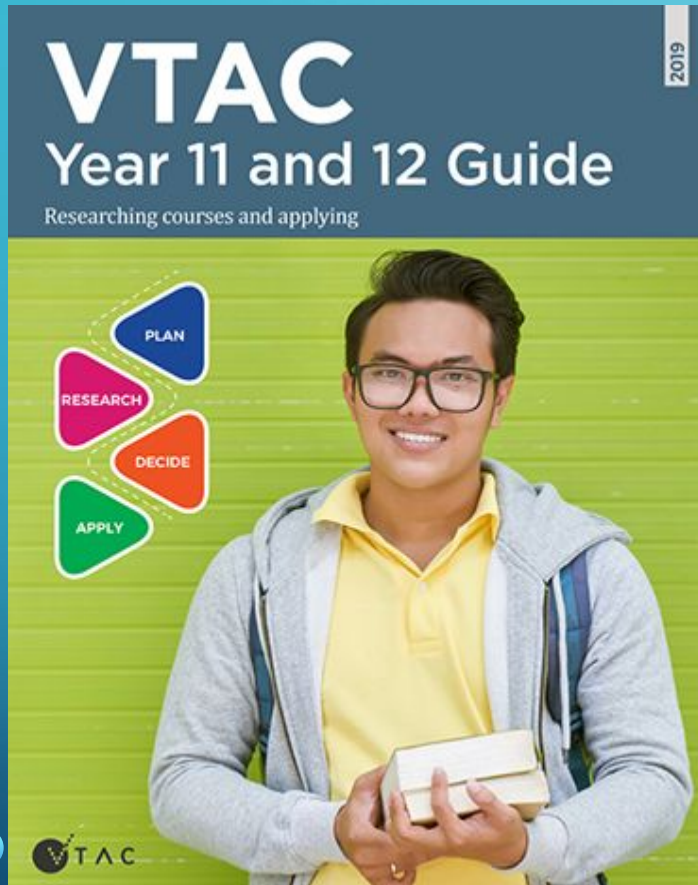
- Must submit online enrolment by the end of August
- Part payment of 50% of the course cost must be paid by the end of August.
- The remaining 50% of the course costs is due by November 3 or student will be withdrawn. This can result in students having significant changes to their senior years program.
- Please note: VET courses are not guaranteed until full payment has been received.

# ADVICE FOR CHOOSING YEAR 12 SUBJECTS



- Your VCE is a 2 year program: Therefore try to choose the same subjects from Year 11 to Year 12 - Unit 1 - 4
- Try to limit any new subjects in Year 12, if possible change no more than 1.
- Students removing Maths from their subject list should check and double check course prerequisites.

- **SCHOOL ASSESSED COURSE WORK** - (SACs) - A set of assessment tasks that assess students' achievement of VCE Units 3 and 4 outcomes.
- **SEMESTER** - Equivalent to half a school year, or two terms.
- **SCHOOL ASSESSED TASKS – (SATs)** - Assessment Tasks undertaken by students at school and which are set by VCAA and graded by teachers. The marks obtained count towards a student's overall study score.
- **SEQUENCE OF UNITS** - Most studies are designed as a sequence of four units to be taken each semester over the two years. Units 1 & 2 are normally attempted in Year 11 and can be undertaken as single units. Units 3 & 4 of a particular study are normally attempted in Year 12 and must be taken as a sequence.
- **STUDY** - A sequence of half year units in a particular curriculum area, for example English, Mathematics, Economics.
- **STUDY DESIGN** - The study design describes the units available within the study and prescribes the objectives, topics, work requirements and assessment tasks. Full description of study designs can be found on the VCAA website.
- **STUDY SCORE** - The study score is the numeric score out of 50 that a student receives for each of their Unit 3 & 4 studies (subjects) in the VCE. The GA/SAT grades received for each study as well as exam results determine the study score.
- **TAFE** - Technical and Further Education.
- **TERTIARY INSTITUTIONS** - Generally Universities.
- **UNIT** - A semester length component of a study (subject) representing approximately 100 hours of work, of which about 50-60 hours is class time.
- **VCAA** - The Victorian Curriculum and Assessment Authority- responsible for curriculum, assessment certification and administration of the VCE and VCAL at Years 11 and 12 in Victoria.
- **Victorian Curriculum** - Victorian Curriculum F-10 Learning areas; English, Mathematics, Science and History.
- **VCE** - Victorian Certificate of Education.
- **VCAL** - Victorian Certificate of Applied Learning.
- **VTAC** - Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre
- **VQA** - The Victorian Qualifications Authority.
