## Principal's Report

At the end of this first term in 2021 I am thankful that we have returned to a more normal routine and that we have been able to enjoy some of the things we weren't able to do in 2020. To see our students back in the school embracing school life and interacting with each other and the staff has been wonderful.

At the end of March, we completed the process of electing a new School Council. I would like to farewell and thank Ajaykumar Krishnadas and Gaye Edmonds for their service to the PCSSC School Council in 2019 and 2020. Your time, contributions and support have been appreciated. We had three parent vacancies to fill and have received two nominations: Eleanor Conduit and Nadia Bono.

There were three staff vacancies and we received three nominations: Shaun Sleep, Bryce Flannery and Melanie Ruskin.

There was one student vacancy and we received two nominations and we conducted a ballot on Friday 19 March, the successful nominee was Braxton Kalolo.

I will welcome the new school councillors at the next school council meeting after the **Annual General Meeting on Thursday 22 April** which will be held in the LRC. At the AGM, I will present the PCSSC Annual Report to the School Community.

Following submissions from the student leadership group and the presentation to school council of a windcheater addition to the school uniform, the school council has decided to form a subcommittee to review the school uniform, the sub-committee will be tabling its report and proposals at the last school council meeting in term 2.

Harmony Week occurred in Week 8, from the 15th of March to the 21st of March. The Advisory events were planned for the Thursday (18th) and Friday (19th), with the casual (cultural) dress day occurring on the Friday.

Harmony Week is an annual event that we run each year at PCSSC and our Student Leaders planned a week of lunchtime events which were highly successful. The event is to promote cultural diversity and awareness within our school community and to encourage students to be proud of their own culture and to share it with their fellow students.

### Principal's Report

On Friday 19 March we also celebrated the National Day of Action Against Bullying. Since launching in March 2013, Bully Stoppers has been helping students, parents, teachers and principals to make sure that schools are safe and supportive places where bullying is taken seriously and not ignored. Bullying can happen at school, at home or online. It is never okay and it is not a normal part of growing up.

There is a new nationally agreed definition of bullying which all Australian schools now use: Bullying is an ongoing and deliberate misuse of power in relationships through repeated verbal, physical and/or social behaviour that intends to cause physical, social and/or psychological harm. It can involve an individual or a group misusing their power, or perceived power, over one or more persons who feel unable to stop it from happening.

Bullying can happen in person or online, via various digital platforms and devices and it can be obvious (overt) or hidden (covert). Bullying behaviour is repeated, or has the potential to be repeated, over time (for example, through sharing of digital records).

Bullying of any form or for any reason can have immediate, medium and long-term effects on those involved, including bystanders.

Student attendance information is available on Compass, including the option to approve absences and input requests to leave early for an appointment.

#### Late Arrival To School

Students are requested to use the Compass card to sign in at the Compass Kiosk at the front of the school.

#### Early Leave

Parent approval is required for any student requesting to leave early. This can be done either by having parents enter approval on Compass or contacting the attendance office. Students are required to provide a medical certificate when absent from a VCE class or assessment
