We have made it to the end of a full term of schooling! Thank you to the PCSSC community for your work in ensuring our school remained safe during Term 1.

The Victorian Government has announced it is extending the RAT screening program for the first 4 weeks of Term 2. Thank you to all students and families who have played their role in regularly testing – we know that hasn't been easy. Your work has seen COVID-19 cases being picked up at the earliest opportunity, meaningless cases in our school, and more time in the classroom for our students. The testing recommendations will remain the same next Term for students and staff with mainstream schools are recommended testing at home twice a week. We will distribute the next round of RAT tests in Week 1 next term in the Advisory class. As we approach winter and flu season, the vaccination of children aged 5 to 11 and booster shots for students 16+ remains the best way to ensure protection for students and staff. The Easter break is a good opportunity to get your child vaccinated ahead of this, with many options across GPs, pharmacies, and the state-run vaccination clinics. If you have any concerns or worries about getting your child vaccinated, please get in contact with your GP or another health professional who can answer your concerns. Thank you again for all your support over Term 1, we couldn't have done it without you.

Term 2 is a significant term for PCSSC, we will be going through the four-year review process to see how we performed against our Strategic Plan 2018 – 2022. From this process, we will be able to set the direction of the school over the next four years in our new Strategic Plan. I would like to thank all the members of the school community who took the time to respond to the surveys we sent out. It is essential to the review that we have the perspective of parents/carers, alumni, and current students. The formal review will occur over a four-day period in May.

This term we have seen a return to students participating in extra-curricular activities, inter-school sports, excursions, socials, special events, and camps. You will be able to read more about each of these in this newsletter. I was particularly impressed by the Harmony Day event organized by our student leaders and I would like to congratulate all those students who made the effort to showcase the rich and varied cultural backgrounds we have here at PCSSC in dance at Friday lunchtime. It highlighted how the student community at PCSSC lives in harmony with each other. It was great to see the Year 12 students enjoy their Social night after being unable to enjoy any events over the last two years.
