Tim Watts MP who is the local federal member in the House of Representatives visited the college on Wednesday 15 March and spoke to our Year 12 Legal Studies students and SRC members on a range of subjects including authority and the development of democracy, the constitution and referendums and republics. The Q & A session was robust and our students asked some very interesting questions.

We followed with a morning tea and meet and greet for the SRC members. There was plenty of photo opportunities.

To conclude the visit, I took Tim on a tour of the college where he asked several staff about their roles and our students.

Mathew Hilikari MP who is the local state member in the Legislative Assembly visited the college on Wednesday 29 March and I took him on a tour of the college and introduced him to staff and students. He was particularly interested in the pathway's destinations of our students and the number of community groups that used our facilities after school had finished during the week and on weekends. I spoke to him about the lack of air conditioning in Government Schools and the possibility of a joint project between Wyndham Council and the Government to build a Community Centre on this site.

Trung Luu MP who is the local state member in the Legislative Council has arranged to visit the college on Monday 8 May to meet with us and the Student School Council representatives.

The under 16s came up against 3 teams to begin with. The first match was up against a team full of basketballers and AFL players, needless to say our boys smashed them and started the day off on a high. After the confidence building, first match, our boys came up against teams with more experience and greater determination to win. However, we were confident and we smashed the first team so our boys were able get over the next two teams to reach the finals. The first final was again Maranatha Christian School. 



## **LRC News**

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




## **Grand Prix**
