Most of our current year 10 and year 11 students complete their course selections for next year and this is enabling us to start putting together the timetable for next year.




Year 12 Psychology


Career News



UNIVERSITY EARLY ENTRY PROGRAM 2022



Swinburne University Early Entry Program allows Year 12 students to apply and receive a conditional early entry offer without an ATAR score (students must meet prerequisite requirements).

Year 12 students that feel their academic results will not be indicative of who they are and what they are capable of are strongly encouraged to apply.

How it works

Step 1: Choose a course

While many Swinburne courses allow Early Entry, not all of them do. Browse the list of Early Entry Program eligible courses before getting started.

Step 2: Organise a recommendation

Step 3: Complete an application

Step 4: Submit your application

Once you've applied, you'll then receive a confirmation email. This will include the form you'll need to forward onto your school representative. Once they've completed that form, your school representative can then send it to us, and we'll pair it with your application.

Applications are now open, and close on Thursday 6th October 2022.


