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# Year 12 AME Behind the Scenes Excursion

The Year 12 Art Making & Exhibition students ventured out to Monash University in Caulfield and Glen Eira City Council Gallery to learn more about conservation of artworks and exhibition design. We were also able to get a personalized tour of the Art and Design faculty at Monash University. Here we saw rooms full of 3D printers and laser cutters for modelmaking and mixed media design thinking beyond traditional artmaking practices. We also walked through the individual studio spaces that each art student is given at the beginning of each year to call their own and have the freedom to express their amazing artistic selves!

We were guided through the Flourish exhibition at Glen Eira by curator Diane Soumilas who walked us through her detailed exhibition design and presentation methods for varying artworks. # **Intermediate Table Tennis**

The boys intermediate table tennis team was formed from six eager Year 10 players who decided to try out their skills (shown every day on the yard training in front of the 100s and the LRC) at the Hobson's Bay Divisional competition at the Bayside Altona North campus which hosted a competition for eight divisional teams.

The Point Cook Senior side won in spectacular fashion, not only taking the divisional premiers title, but also managing to go "completely undefeated", winning all three ranking rounds 6-0 and defeating Alamanda's top side 6-0 in the grand final match. Aayush Timsina and Sanket Chopda were a solid anchor for the team in every contest, playing seed 1 and 2 respectively, and managing to win out against the best the other schools had to offer. But the strength of the team was also found in its depth, as Vic Jelf, Peter Hancin, Eric Zheng and Harsh Verma all proved themselves up to the task. Jelf and Hancin were the regular 3 and 4 spot, with Zheng able to take on duties against a Bayside squad and dismissing their fourth rank player to keep the side's record untarnished. Verma played a specialist role, teaming up woth Timsina and Chopda to frustrate teams' attempts to salvage in the doubles competition.

Sometimes the lopsided scores were deceptive, and there were several tense matches during the day that saw PCSSC students show adaptability and mental toughness to not only stay in the match but on several occasions work from being down in games and still come back to claim victory. Excellent play all around, and the team will play in Term 4 at the Western Regionals where they will be a team to beat.





# **Athletics Day**

The Point Cook Senior Athletics Day was held 28 July this year at the Wyndham Sports Track which saw the school's house competition playout in spectacular fashion. All year levels competed in a series of running, jumping and throwing events in which competition points were awarded for top finishers, total participation, and also for SRC-run novelty events. Tug-of-war, spikeball, scavenger hunts, and a costume contest gave all students fun activities to participate in and contribute towards the day. Year 12s were invited to come to the day in costume and all year levels were encouraged to wear house colours to support their side.

The competition saw a strong showing from every House, but this year top place went to the Demons (269), who managed to create a convincing lead early on and hold off second place Sabres (201). Huey (161) came in third in a tightly contested battle with Dragons (134) for the podium spot. Individual efforts were on display the entire day, with the top athletes at each age group also qualifying to compete in the divisional round competition, with eyes on potentially competing in the Western Metro regionals.

A special thanks to all competitors as well as both students and staff who helped to run events, organise and direct onlookers, and to all students who made the day a safe, fun, and successful all school event.
